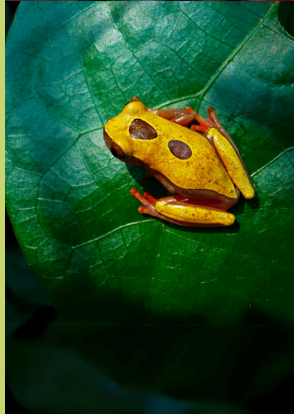
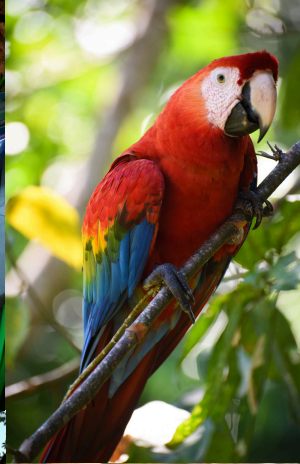

What began in 1999 to support a small group of Brazil nut harvesters has grown into a powerful, Amazon-wide movement that safeguard more than 14.6 million acres of irreplaceable rainforest.

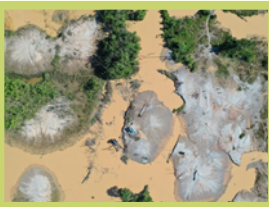

# OUR PROGRAMS



Protecting the Core of the Amazon: The heart of the Amazon, with its vast protected areas and Indigenous territories that cover half of the Amazon, forms the basin's most important refuge against climate change and biodiversity loss. We are working to establish new protected areas in Peru and Bolivia; safeguard connectivity for species to be able to adapt to climate change and survive; monitor biodiversity and forest health with science and technology like the tropics' largest camera trap grid; and promote greater understanding of the issues that affect the entire Amazon.



Halting Illegal Deforestation: We combine cutting-edge technology, grassroots capacity building, and high-level advocacy to stop illegal deforestation before it spreads. Through flagship initiatives like our Monitoring of the Amazon Andes Program (MAAP), we provide real-time satellite, radar, and drone data across 100% of the Amazon biome (478+ million acres). This actionable intelligence empowers Indigenous groups, local organizations, and governments to rapidly detect incursions, strengthen enforcement, and hold perpetrators accountable.



Building a Forest-Based Economy: We strengthen community-led enterprises built on Brazil nuts, açai, *aguaje*, wild cacao, and other forest goods across more than 37 million acres of Peru, Bolivia, and soon, Brazil. By fostering regional bioeconomy initiatives and diversifying forest economies, we strengthen sustainable livelihoods that enhance resilience, keep trees standing, and build incentives for conservation, thereby reducing pressure on wildlife habitats and decreasing deforestation.



Driving Policy Change: Since threats to the Amazon don't stop at borders, solutions can't either. We use our scientific expertise and localized experience to advocate for policies that prioritize effective solutions and drive Amazon-wide action. From standardizing gold mining regulations to developing tools like the Amazon Action Tracker, we're leading our partnership network in holding governments accountable to conservation commitments and securing stronger protections for forests and people.

## Amazon Conservation fills a unique and essential role in the conservation landscape:

- **Holistic, long-term strategy** that builds climate resilience and empowers local communities.
- **Trusted reputation** with governments, Indigenous communities, private landowners, and non-governmental organizations.

- **Local leadership** that ensures solutions are culturally grounded and community-driven.

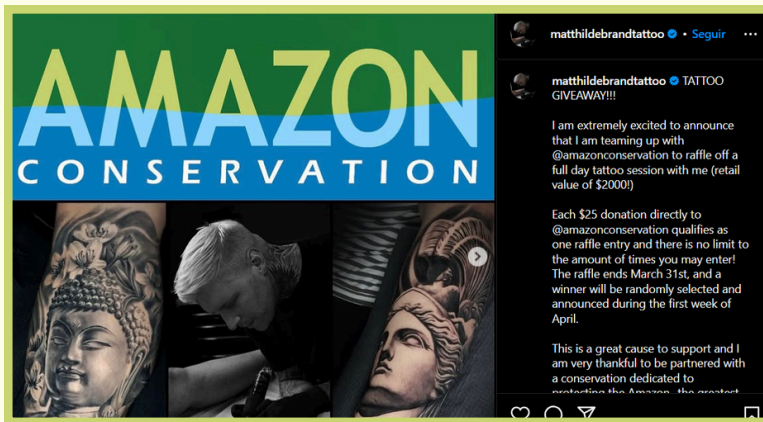

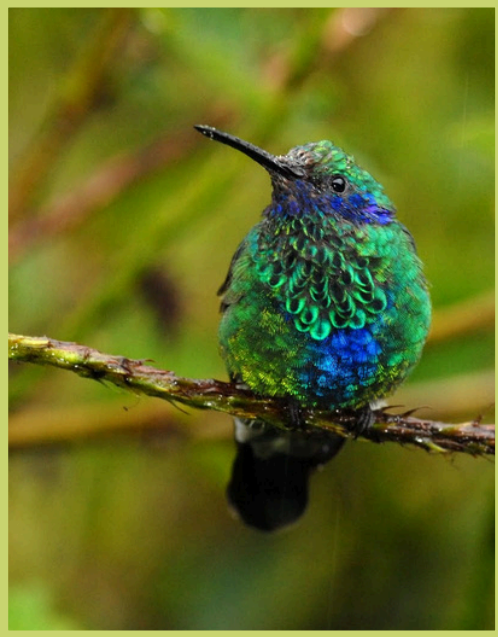
## In-Kind Supporter

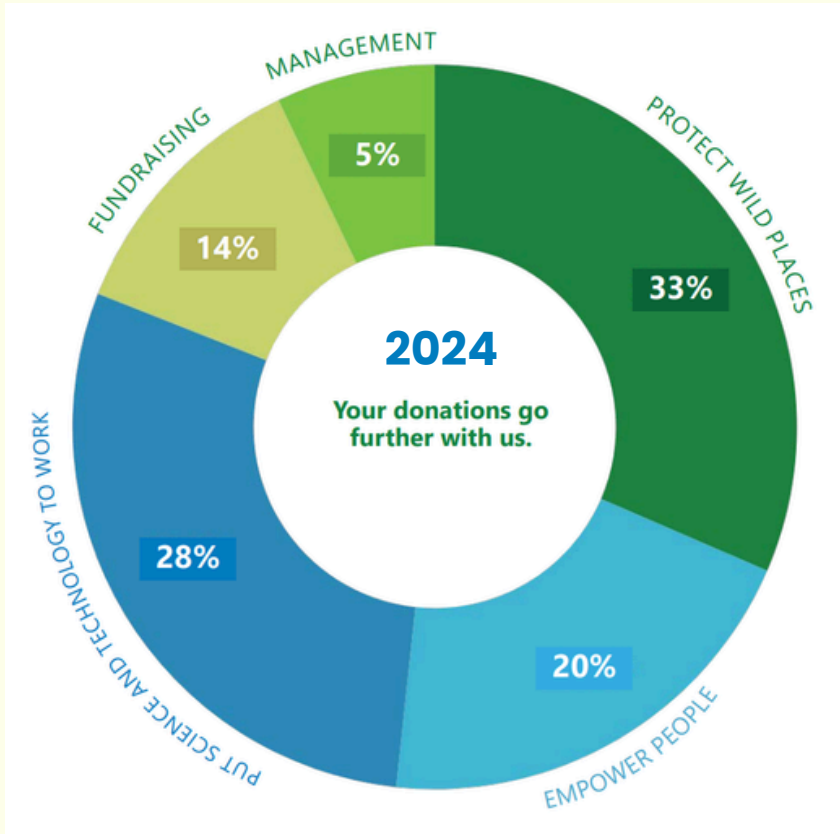
## Your contribution has a real impact.

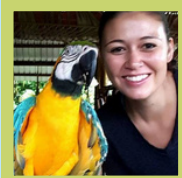
